Dear St. John's Friends—

The month of April will be an exciting month for St. John's for at least 3 reasons. First progress is being made in the call process to secure a new, permanent pastor for St. John's. It's still in the confidential stage at this point. But, with prayer, grace, and persistence, we may reach the stage soon

where knowledge can be made public! If it wasn't in the middle of Lent, I'd be tempted to shout "Alleluia!" (whoops, sorry about that). Please, please keep the Call Committee, Council, and Candidate in your prayers.

The second reason to count April as an exciting month, is that Bishop Macholz is scheduled to be with you on the Sunday after Easter, April 28th. Your 175th Anniversary Committee is making plans for a special breakfast to be held that morning both to celebrate his visit and to enjoy the 175th anniversary. What a special time that will be.

The third reason is really the reason behind everything we do here at St. John's: April is the month we celebrate the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. His transition from the stone-cold tomb to risen life secures all the transitions we endure. The pattern of dying and rising is the pattern of Christian life. We die to self, and live in Christ. St. Paul put it this way in 2nd Timothy:

"The saying is sure: If we have died with him, we will also live with him; if we endure, we will also reign with him."

A congregation like St. John's, with a rich history of 175 years, knows intuitively the truth of Paul's words. It breathes through the very wood and stone of the building. St. John's has transitioned many times over the years. The past has given way to the future, and the same God worshipped by the founders of this church, is the God you worship. Never doubt or deny the power of the resurrection on the life of your congregation.

For all these reasons, as I reflect on my own role as your Transition pastor, I look forward to the bright future God has in store for you, as a new pastor emerges, and new life begins!

A Message About Global Mission

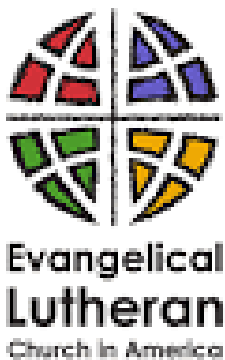
The ELCA supports over 240 missionaries in 40 countries around the world. Countries of every letter of the alphabet (except Q & X!) from Angola to Zimbabwe. Most of them don't have to raise their own funds to support their service, as missionaries in many other denominations do. Instead, their work is funded through the Mission Support that congregations send to their synods, as well as direct donations.

Rafael Padilla, executive director of ELCA Global Mission says, "What sets the ELCA apart from other denominations is the support system we have in place for people who serve on behalf of this church."

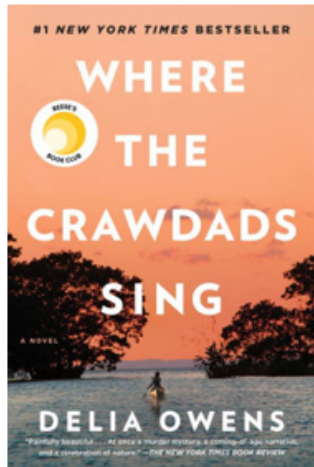
As we go through this transition period at St. John's, we ask you prayerfully consider how you are sharing your time, your talents and your treasures.

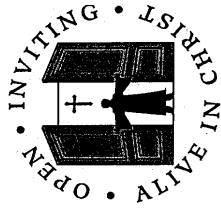
