
MISSION STATEMENT

I really like a clean office. Sure I love having shelves full of knickknacks, and I like pictures on the wall, but I like the space to be clean and tidy. Yet it seems to become cluttered often enough. Papers pile up, boxes from projects I'm working on accumulate, and who knows what else seems to fill the room. It never happens all at once; it's slow and steady. A few papers become a pile. One box becomes two, and before I know it, I've got enough things accumulated to look like I'm having a garage sale. It's never all at once, it's always gradual, but to remedy the situation takes one concerted effort- deciding it's time to clean out my office and following through. I don't think I am alone in this. I bet many of you have a space in your home where things have accumulated over time and the space has slowly become less of a functional space. Attics, basements and crawl spaces are notorious for this treatment. But it's not just our physical spaces that become occupied in this manner.

Our mind's can get filled up too. The opinions of others, the worries of this world, voices in the media or on the news. So many things fill our minds. All of this can distract us from who God is calling us to be, making it harder to hear the "still small voice of God". Just as we need to pause and clean out our physical spaces, we need to pause and examine the things that take up our mental energy, the things that cloud our perceptions, the things that distract from God.

But you, beloved, build yourselves up on your most holy faith; pray in the Holy Spirit; keep yourselves in the love of God; look forward to the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life. And have mercy on some who are wavering; save others by snatching them out of the fire; and have mercy on still others with fear, hating even the tunic defiled by their bodies. Now to him who is able to keep you from falling and to make you stand without blemish in the presence of his glory with rejoicing, to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, power, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen. (Jude 1: 20-25)

In Jude we are being encouraged to focus on our faith, to let our faith in God define our lives, and not let those other voices and influences define who we understand God to be. Jude extols us to encourage others in the faith as well, to divert them away from mindsets that pull them away from God. In a world where so many seek to divide, Jude calls us to gather people together to help them see Christ, even if we disagree with their actions or stances on issues we care about.



Book Club





Please join us at the Conference Table downstairs in the Chapel Hall at St. John's Lancaster (using the ramp entrance) on Wednesday, October 22nd at 2:30 PM to discuss the novel, HESTER, by Laurie Lico Albanese.

Isobel Gamble is a young seamstress carrying generations of secrets when she sets sail from Scotland in the early 1800s with her husband, Edward. An apothecary who has fallen under the spell of opium, his pile of debts have forced them to flee Edinburgh for a fresh start in the New World. But only days after they've arrived in Salem, Edward abruptly joins a departing ship as a medic—leaving Isobel penniless and alone in a strange country, forced to make her way by any means possible.

When she meets a young Nathaniel Hawthorne, the two are instantly drawn to each other: he is a man haunted by his ancestors, who sent innocent women to the gallows—while she is an unusually gifted needleworker, troubled by her own strange talents. As the weeks pass and Edward's safe return grows increasingly unlikely, Nathaniel and Isobel grow closer and closer. Together, they are a muse and a dark storyteller; the enchanter and the enchanted. But which is which?

In this sensuous and hypnotizing tale, a young immigrant woman grapples with our country's complicated past, and learns that America's ideas of freedom and liberty often fall short of their promise. Interwoven with Isobel and Nathaniel's story is a vivid interrogation of who gets to be a "real" American in the first half of the 19th century, a depiction of the early days of the Underground Railroad in New England, and the history of unusual women being accused of witchcraft.

Read this imagined origin story to THE SCARLET LETTER; then come (as your schedule permits) and share your thoughts and ideas. Friends and guests are always welcome!
