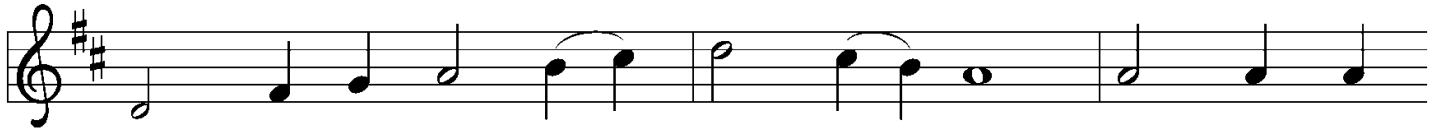

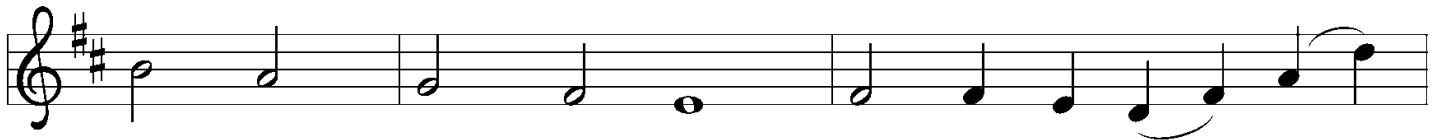

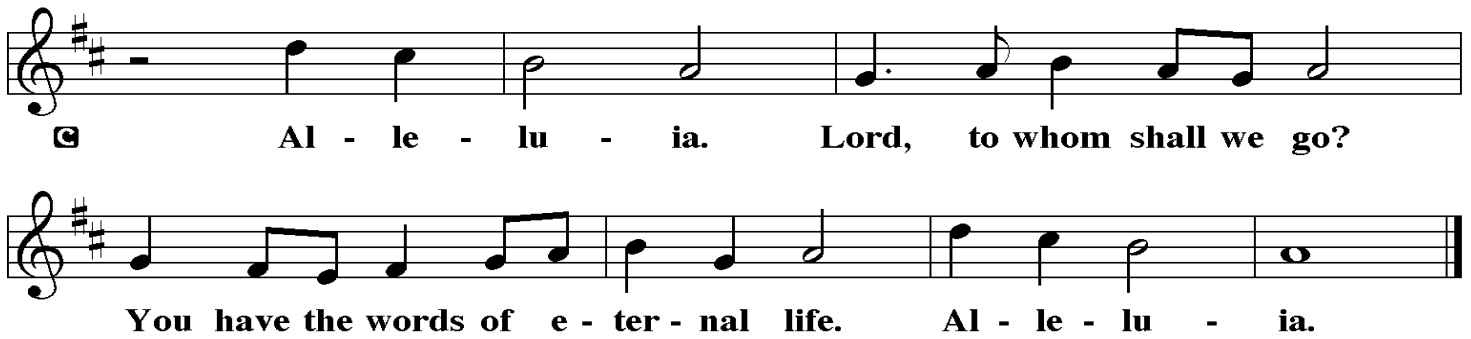
The Second Reading

The Gospel Reading Luke 23:33-43 **Glory to you, O God.**

The Preface

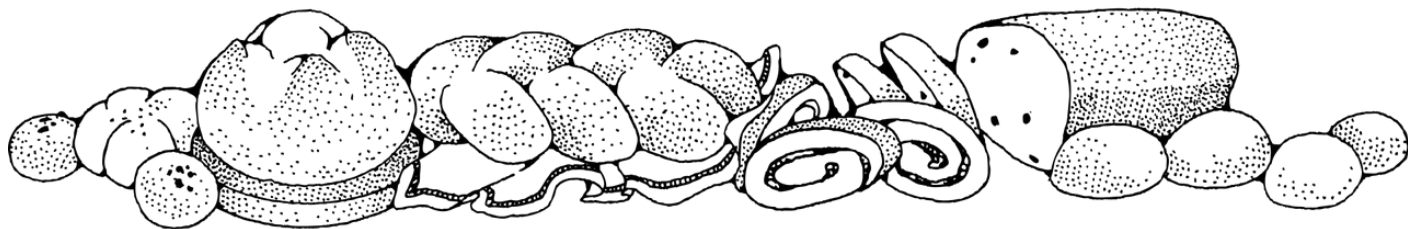

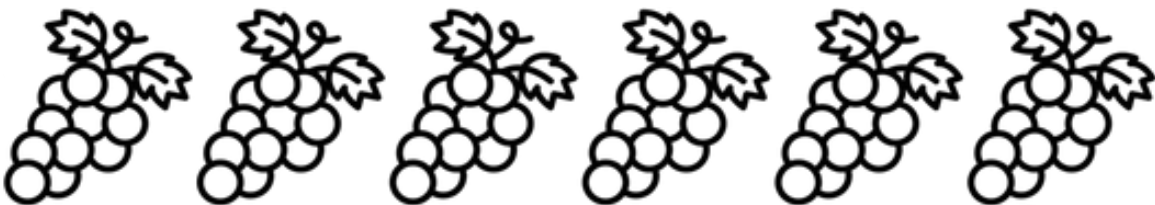
