#### Pastor's Message



On Pentecost I wanted to spend some time preaching about all that the Spirit has done for us at St. John's, both throughout our history and today. The truth is that our history is a remarkable one, from early German settlers to the area founding the church, to the building being stolen, to reconciling with those who stole the building. The faith and courage shown by our fore-bearers to be led by the Spirit in bold and daring ways. Those moments of faith, courage and accomplishment aren't only relegated to the past however.

Oftentimes we have a tendency to focus on the negative. This is actually a survival technique that we as people have learned. By focusing on the negative, we can more quickly identify threats and potential problems. The drawback is that we can slip into a "glass half empty" mindset. We see the negative but miss the positive. If we take a step back, we can see that there are quite a few amazing things being worked by the Spirit.

We are exploring and moving ahead with a partnership arrangement with St. John's, Elma. What better way to show that the work of the Church goes beyond the walls of the building than by working with and helping another congregation? This sort of 2 partnership is truly an opportunity to extend our ministry in new ways. On top of that, it is not a one-way relationship. The partnership will also enhance our ministry as well. I've begun to think of the arrangement as St. John's . When you square a number in math, you do more than simply add the two numbers up, you multiply them, ending up with something far greater than the original number. I see that opportunity here.

It is also a special year as LYMA is celebrating their 150th anniversary. How wonderful is it that for a century and a half the young men (and young at heart) of this congregation have been doing all that they do? Just in this past year they had handrails installed leading to the ramp, have supported our youth and more. That is of course on top of the simple act of fellowship which they share together.

This year we were also blessed with an unexpected and awe inspiring bequest. One which the council will propose be used to start an endowment. The interest will allow for our future security, security which we will use to boldly do ministry and the work of the Gospel in our community and in the world. I can't wait to share with you the details of all of this when the time comes.

But the good news keeps on coming. The Synod has approached us with the proposal of being an internship congregation again. A ministry that was for many years a blessing to the congregation has a chance to be revived and begin anew. It would look a bit different, as this intern would be part-time, serving a few number of hours per week over a greater number of years. The council will be discussing this opportunity at our next meeting.

These are all signs that the Spirit is active among us, but they are not the only signs. The work of all of you who support the congregation with your time and talent is also a sign of the Spirit's activity. The council, musicians, Sunday school leaders, youth leaders, committee members, staff, ushers, altar guild and so many more are all signs that the Spirit is with us every day.

Finally I want to leave you with words from the prophet Jeremiah (29:11), the words speak to all of God's people but I want to make sure that you hear them:

"For I know the plans I have for you,"

declares the LORD,

"plans to prosper you and not to harm you,

plans to give you hope and a future."

"Those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:31)

In my first letter for a "LifeLines" newsletter, almost 15 years ago, I wrote that we were standing at the crossroads between hunger and hope. I was convinced then that hope is winning, and I continue to hold that conviction because of you — the faithful partners in our work toward a just world where all are fed.

In 2022 gifts to ELCA World Hunger and Lutheran Disaster Response approached \$46 million, the largest combined total of all time. Thank you!

We live in a time when hope might seem the road less traveled. Around the globe, climate change, political unrest, a record number of displaced people, and food systems taxed by a global pandemic and the Russian invasion of Ukraine are all driving hunger and poverty. Yet closer examination reveals that the less-traveled road of hope is an ever-widening one that holds inspiring surprises we can celebrate together.

Just in the last year, ELCA World Hunger and Lutheran Disaster Response were at work in 76 countries and 43 U.S. states and territories.

After many years of working in the church to address hunger, I am still confident in the promise that "hope abides." Through the vocations and creativity of individuals, congregations, companions and partners around the world, your gifts to ELCA World Hunger and Lutheran Disaster Response are at work doing just that — providing fresh food through community gardens in Brazil, advocating for stronger policies to address the root causes of hunger here in the United States, improving incomes for families in Lebanon, providing fistula surgeries for women in South Sudan and rebuilding after the earthquake in Nepal five years on. Thank you for answering God's invitation to share in this work.


