Thanks be to God.



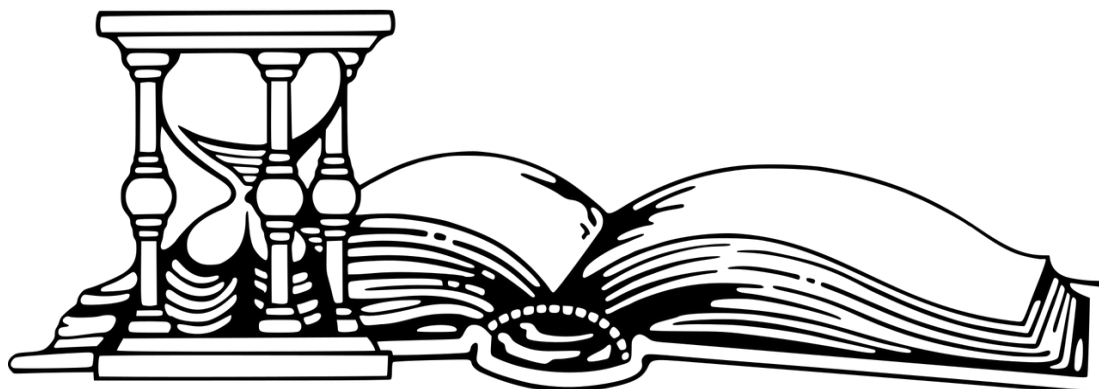

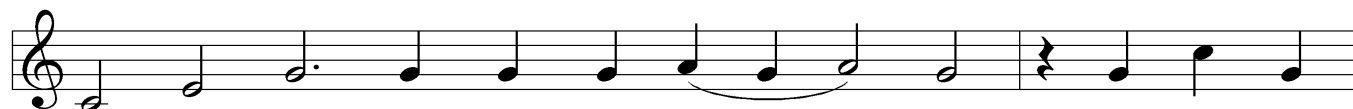
The Gospel Reading

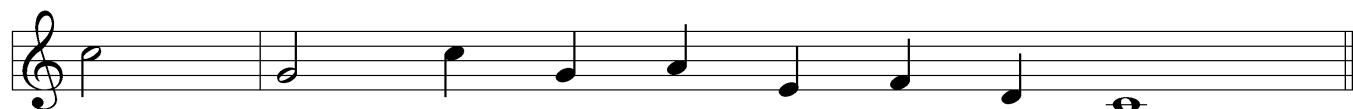

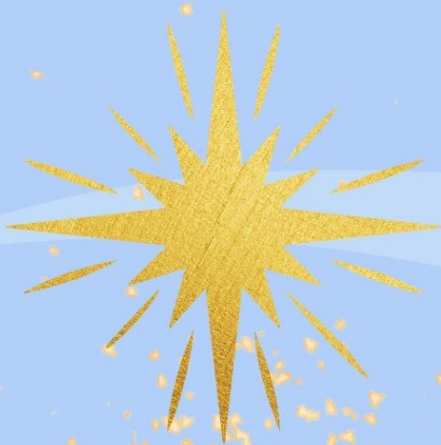
