


Silence is kept for reflection.



The First Reading Acts 3:12-19 (NRSVUE)

[Peter] addressed the people, "Fellow Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? The God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. Offer the appointed sacrifices, and put your trust in the Lord.


Many are saying, "Who will show us any good?" Let the light of your face shine upon us, O Lord.

The Gospel Reading Luke 24:36b-48 Glory to you, O God.


