Rejoice in the way of the Lord. Amen.


#### The Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Peace be within your walls and quietness within your towers.


#### For the sake of my kindred and companions, I pray for your prosperity.

The Gospel Reading Matthew 24:36-44 Glory to you, O God.





Lord remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray...


