Pastor's Message



Spring here in western New York is quite an interesting thing. Spring is associated with green grass, chirping birds, blooming flowers and the chill of winter departing. But when it kicks off here in WNY its still frigid out, bodies of water are still frozen, piles of snow can still be seen and you aren't ready to put your shovel away just yet. Then out of the blue one day it will be 70 or 80 degrees, and you may be tempted to think that winter is over but two days later the snow is flying again. Winter always ends here in WNY, the warm weather eventually returns but the process is slow and with a lot of starts and stops. We may want it to be a smooth clean transition but its usually anything but. This same feeling can be found with resurrection and the promise of new life.

From the very beginning of the Church the followers of Jesus knew they were living a new life in Christ. The first verse of 2nd Timothy begins "Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ, by the will of God, according to the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus." They knew that things were different. The Messiah had come and that life had changed. At the same time however their struggles were plentiful. Early followers feuded with one another, they were arrested, Peter and Paul had some disagreements and most of the original 12 ended up being put to death. Those sorts of problems continued and continue to this day. Plagues, wars, crusades, have marked the centuries and to this day it is still outlawed in some places to be a Christian. In many ways the new life in Christ can feel like spring coming to Buffalo. It comes in fits and starts. It can feel like spring has arrived only for the cold of winter to return and it can feel like that new life is blooming only for a darker colder time to return.

Spring always does arrive however. It may be later than we like, it may be after several false starts but it does arrive. So too is the promise that Jesus gives us, it will arrive, it will come, that new life will overcome the darkness of this world. Thats why the timing of Easter is so paramount, it echoes the promise that Christ has given us. It may take some trust to see past the current situation but as sure as spring will come so too will the promise of new life in Christ. May we trust in the promises of Christ just as we trust that new life will break forth in the dawning of Spring.

Mission Message



THE GIFT OF GOATS IN NEPAL

During the Easter season we celebrate new life — and all the ways our siblings in Christ experience it around the world. For Ram Kala Kadha in Nepal, new hope and new life arrived in the form of four goats.

After Ram Kala's husband died, she wasn't sure how she would support her four children. "I just did traditional farming," she says. "I worked hard, but the land only produced enough for four months." She worried about how she would keep food on the table and support her children in the future. She often went to bed on an empty stomach.

Then, a few years ago, Ram Kala connected with the Ekikrit Bikash Manch (EBM) organization. EBM partners with the United Mission to Nepal, which is supported by gifts to ELCA World Hunger. Through EBM's food security program Ram Kala received training in home garden management, financial literacy, climate change adaptation and more. Eventually she was selected to receive four goats and goat-keeping training.

Ram Kala's goats, along with the vegetables from her home garden, have increased her income and helped her create a stable future for her children. She has been able to pay for their schooling and support her daughter's work toward a bachelor's degree. Ram Kala now has six goats and plans to continue increasing her herd.




