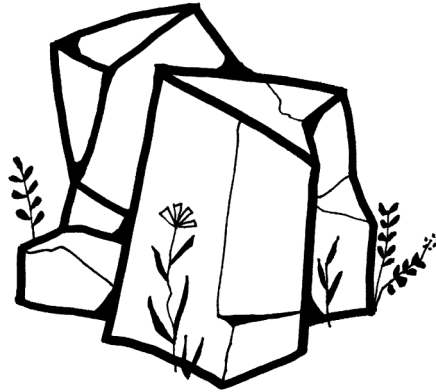

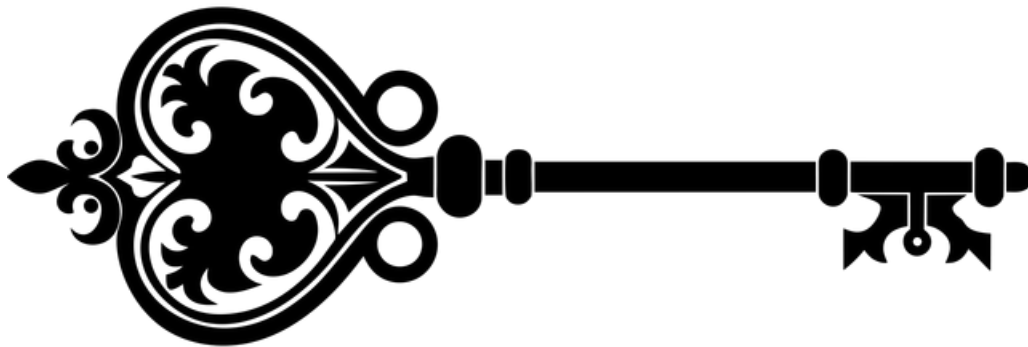

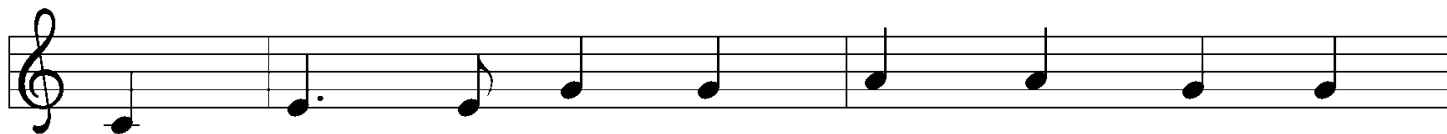
Glory to you, O God.

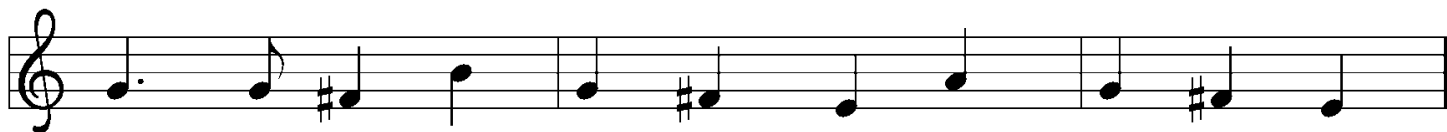

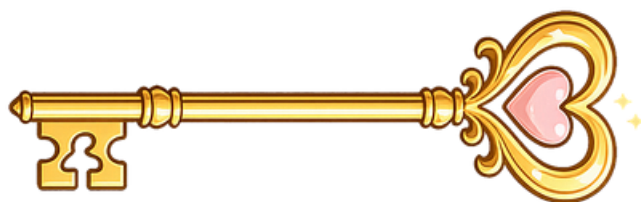

May the body and blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace. **Amen.**

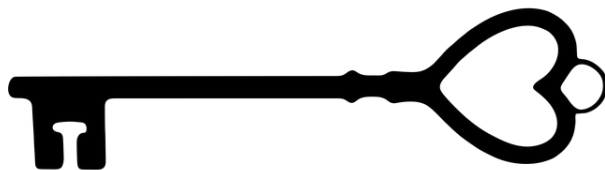

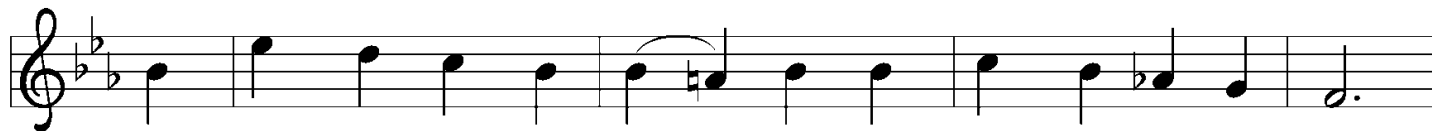
