Pastor's Message

From Pastor Jamie

This past year has been an exercise in changing expectations. When we first had to transition to remote services I thought it would last a few weeks, my expectations changed. When it became clear that we would be remote for Easter I started planning a drive in service, but the county said no to that idea and my expectations changed. When it became clear that this was going to go on for quite some time I had hoped that when we opened we could open all at once, welcome everyone back, have a grand celebration and things would be like normal; expectations changed. Eventually the reality sunk in, that this would be gradual. Different people would have to decide for themselves when it was safe and wise to return to everyday activities like returning to church. I realized that for those who were ready we needed to be ready too and for those not yet ready we needed to offer the best remote options we could and patiently await their return to in person. In other words our reopening plan couldn't be one size fits all. All of us find ourselves in different situations with different

considerations. Easter was the most open we've been in a year. We have pews blocked off to maintain distance, we wore masks and we didn't move around for the peace but we were open. At the end of the 10:30 service the processional cross, which had been mounted in the narthex since our last service before the pandemic processed back into the sanctuary and took its spot in the chancel. It wasn't what I had originally set my expectations on but it was a truly moving moment. Rather than welcome everyone back all at once we have prepared our space, even if everyone who was regularly attending before the pandemic returned all at one we can still worship and maintain social distance. I shifted my expectations and god provided. I feel like these experiences can help us to reinforce lessons taught to us through scripture.

Matthew 6: 9-13

**“This, then, is how you should pray:
“Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from the evil one.’**

The Lord's Prayer is a series of petitions, or things we ask for (We ring the steeple bell for each petition during the service). Each petition asks for God to be in control, for God's will to be done, for God's kingdom to come, for God to forgive and provide. Instead of asking for our own wants and desires we ask for God's. There is an admission in this, which is God's will and way is more perfect than our own. That's not a controversial or bold proclamation but it is an important one that can be clouded over in a world built around wants and desires. Just as this past year taught us that in the face of a pandemic we have to adjust our expectations so to must we with God. God will exceed our expectations but in God's way not our own. Just as my changing pandemic expectations resulted in the cross being front and center so to should we live our lives. We should live our lives in prayer, seeking God's will, building God's kingdom, welcoming God's forgiveness and preparing for God to provide the things that God knows we truly need. So set your expectations aside and instead look to the cross.
