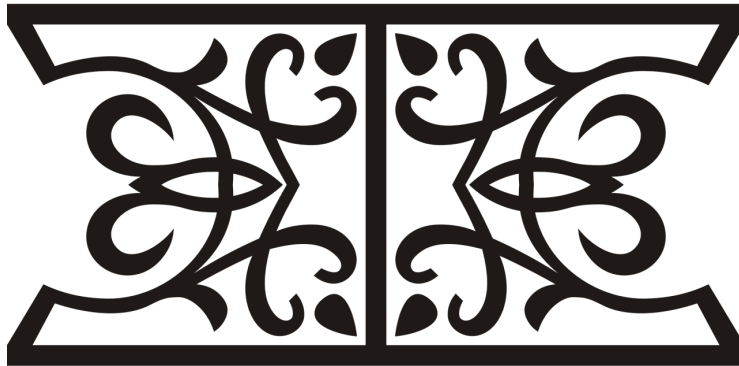

Confession and Forgiveness

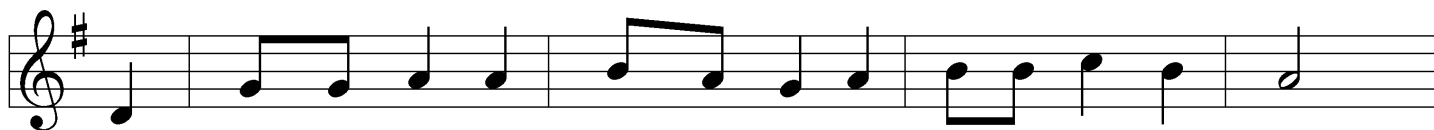
